Job Responsibilities & Overview

Operation and maintenance of a wide variety of equipment. (Backhoes, Excavators, Dump Trucks, Snow Plows, Tractors, Lawn Mowers etc.) Employee will be responsible for street maintenance, infrastructure repairs, building maintenance and general construction including park and cemetery maintenance and landscaping for a variety of Village owned properties. Employee must have a good understanding and familiarity of computers and software including but not limited to Microsoft Word and Excel. Employee must be able to work on call outside of standard working schedules, including early mornings, evenings, weekends and holidays and be physically able to perform all job duties.

- Under the general supervision of the Public Works Supervisor, provide general labor support of a wide range of public works maintenance projects.
- Participate in the installation, inspection and maintenance of water and sewer services and water meters; Participate in the location and repair of leaks in water distribution systems; Ability to safely operated Excavators, Backhoes, Trucks, mowers and other equipment as desired; Participate in the installation and repair of fire hydrants, service connections and the laying of lines.
- Locate and mark water and sewer mains and service lines upon request; Investigate and respond to citizen complaints; Read meters; Participate in regular hydrant flushing and valve exercising programs; May perform Public Works functions such as install, maintain and / or repair Village sewers, streets, sidewalks, buildings and traffic signs.
- Assist with seasonal Village operations and maintenance including landscaping, snow removal, parks and recreation, water system, pathways, picking up trash and minor construction and repairs. Assist in digging and burial, footing settings in Riverside Cemetery.
- Ability to perform basic maintenance and service to light vehicles, trucks, equipment such as trimmers, mowers, edgers, blowers, wheelbarrows, hand tools and pruning tools.
- Adheres to all applicable safety procedures while operating equipment and tools.
- Expected to deal with the public and coworkers in a courteous and respectful manner and perform duties in a safe and efficient manner.
- Duties require a full range of physical motion and activities including manual digging, pushing, pulling, lifting 100 lbs, twisting and turning the upper body, stooping, kneeling, crouching, climbing, balancing, crawling, reaching for objects, walking and standing.



It has been noted that citizens have recently become dependent on contacting the Police Department via the general office phone. Although it is ok to contact us using the office phone, if there is something happening that needs attention by an officer, the best and quickest way to get in contact with someone from the Police Department is through Central Dispatch.

In the case of an emergency always dial 911.

The Monroe County Central Dispatch center is always in constant radio contact with our on duty officer.

734-243-7070 is the number you should call if you need a police officer sent to your house for non-emergency services.

Please make note of this number so that you may better activate and utilize the services that your Police Department provides.

SCAM ALERT!!! SCAM ALERT!!!

If you are receiving <u>threatening calls</u> from the "IRS", ignore them and DO NOT call them back.

**A caller may also say that you have a refund coming in order to trick you into sharing personal information,

DO NOT return these calls either.**

The IRS reminds people that they can know pretty easily when a "supposed IRS" caller is a fake.

Here are six things that scammers often do, <u>but the IRS will not</u> <u>do</u>. Any one of these six things is a tell-tale sign of a scam.

The IRS will never:

- 1. The IRS will never call to demand immediate payment.
- 2. The IRS will never call about taxes owed without first having mailed you a bill.
- 3. The IRS will never demand that you pay taxes without giving you the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you owe.
- 4. The IRS will never require you use a specific payment method for your taxes, such as a prepaid debit card.
- 5. The IRS will never ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- 6. The IRS will never threaten to bring in local police or other law-enforcement groups to have you arrested for not paying.

Be courteous and clean up waste left by your animal.



Stormwater- Keep it fresh:

Stormwater is any water that falls into the ground, including rain, hail and snow.

This water flows off ground surfaces and into underground pipe systems, where it makes its way into local waterways. Water is our most precious natural resource.

Keep it fresh. Allow only rain down the stormdrain.

Tips to keep our water fresh:

- Pick up pet waster and dispose of it in the trash.
- Never fertilize your lawn before a storm. Reduce the amount of chemicals you apply to your lawn.
- If you can, implement a rain garden at your house. Green infrastructure, such as rain gardens, help water absorb into the ground, preventing water and pollutant runoff.

Please remember that Ord-35,102 Section 2. states that rubbish containers shall be placed at the curb no earlier than 5:00 p.m. of the day preceding the collection day and all containers must be taken in prior to 8:00 p.m. on the day of collection and placed out of general view. This includes recycle totes. Totes & trash cans damaged by traffic will be replaced at the expense of the homeowner. Thank you for your cooperation!

Weed / Grass Control Ordinance

Notice is given that all weeds, *brush* and *grass* growing on any lands except as exempt under the ordinances of the Village of South Rockwood must be *cut* and maintained at a height not to exceed six inches and destroyed and removed to prevent such weeds, *brush* and *grass* from going to seed, from becoming a fire hazard and/or creating a condition detrimental to the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village of South Rockwood.

Failure to comply with the notice and ordinance on or before May 1 shall make the property owner liable for the costs of *cutting*, destroying and removing the weeds, *brush* and *grass* by the Village of South Rockwood or its representatives or agents and the costs may be levied and collected in the same manner as taxes are levied and collected and being a lien upon the land. The village may *cut* the weeds, *brush* and *grass* as often as necessary to achieve compliance with the ordinance and charge costs to the property.

Yard Waste:

Grass clippings & leaves will be picked up in every Monday. They need to be in a green mesh or biodegradable bag.

Brush is picked up on the 2nd and 4th Monday of the month. Please have it at the road by 6:00am. Sticks and brush must have cut ends facing the road.

No thorns or poison ivy/oak. Do not put dirt in bags. Any bag over 50 pounds will be left behind. Do not use plastic garbage bags.
