GUN REGISTRATIONS:

- The Village of South Rockwood is not involved in any part of the gun registration process.

CONTACTING YOUR LOCAL POLICE DEPARTMENT:

MONROE COUNTY NON-EMERGENCY DISPATCH PHONE NUMBER 734-243-7070 In case of Emergency, Dial 911

It has been noted that citizens have recently become dependent on contacting the Police Department via the general office phone.

Although it is ok to contact us using the office phone, if there is something happening that needs attention by an officer, the best and quickest way to get in contact with someone from the Police Department is through Central Dispatch.

In the case of an emergency always dial 911.

The Monroe County Central Dispatch center is always in constant radio contact with our on duty officer. 734-243-7070 is the number you should call if you need a police officer sent to your house for non-emergency services.

Please make note of this number so that you may better activate and utilize the services that your Police Department provides.

SCAM ALERT!!! SCAM ALERT!!!

If you are receiving <u>threatening calls</u> from the "IRS", ignore them and DO NOT call them back.

**A caller may also say that you have a refund coming in order to trick you into sharing personal information,

DO NOT return these calls either.**

The IRS reminds people that they can know pretty easily when a "supposed IRS" caller is a fake.

Here are six things that scammers often do, <u>but the IRS will not</u> <u>do</u>. Any one of these six things is a tell-tale sign of a scam.

The IRS will never:

- 1. The IRS will never call to demand immediate payment.
- 2. The IRS will never call about taxes owed without first having mailed you a bill.
- 3. The IRS will never demand that you pay taxes without giving you the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you owe.
- 4. The IRS will never require you use a specific payment method for your taxes, such as a prepaid debit card.
- 5. The IRS will never ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- 6. The IRS will never threaten to bring in local police or other law-enforcement groups to have you arrested for not paying.

WARNING GRANDKID SCAMS

HERE'S HOW THEY WORK:

You get a call: "Grandma, I need money for a ball". Or money for a medical bill. Or some other kind of trouble. The caller says it's urgent— and tells you to keep it secret.

But is the caller who you think it is? Scammers are good at pretending to be someone they're not. They can be convincing: someone using information from social networking sites, or hacking into your loved one's email account to make it seem more real. And they'll pressure you to send more before you have time to think.

HERE'S WHAT YOU CAN DO:

1- Stop. Check it out.

Look up your grandkid's phone number yourself, or call another family member.

2- Pass this information to a friend.

You may not have gotten one of these calls, but chances are you know someone who will get one—if they haven't already.

PLEASE REPORT SCAMS:

If you spot a scam, please report it to the Federal Trade Commission.

WARNING

Foreign scammers are stealing money from Michigan Seniors daily

Law enforcement agencies within Monroe Co. and all over the state are reporting an increase in fraudulent scams targeting senior citizens.

Reports indicate scammers are telephoning or using pop-up notices on the internet to mislead senior citizens into believing that their bank account and private information have been hacked. The victims are instructed to withdraw large amounts of cash from their savings or checking accounts and deposit those funds into Bitcoin machines. The caller then falsely claims that the money is being deposited into a new, individual Bitcoin account belonging to the victim. When actually the victims have transferred cash into a foreign bank account belonging to the scammers and have no possibility of getting their money back.

The scammers claim to represent either the federal reserve, a government agency, bank security or Microsoft. The scammer cautions the senior citizen NOT to tell anyone, including a bank representative, the real reason for the withdraw, because the caller convinces the victim that an employee of their bank is involved with the alleged theft.

If you receive a call like this or a pop-up notification on the internet, hang-up and ignore them. Notify police. The scammer will not continue to call you if you don't take their bait. The number from which the victims are called are often spoofed or ghosted and is not the real name or location of the caller. Although Federal Law Enforcement agencies are assisting, most of these scammers are from foreign countries that do not honor United States search warrants or extraditions. Please share this information.

WEED / GRASS CONTROL ORDINANCE

NOTICE IS GIVEN

That all **weeds**, **brush and grass** growing on any lands except as exempt under the ordinances of the Village of South Rockwood must be **cut and maintained at a height not to exceed six inches** and destroyed and removed to prevent such weeds, brush and grass from going to seed, from becoming a fire hazard and/or creating a condition detrimental to the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village of South Rockwood.

Failure to comply with this notice and ordinance on or before

May 1st shall make the property owner liable for the cost of cutting, destroying and removing the weeds, brush and grass by the Village of South Rockwood or its representative or agents and the costs may be levied and collected in the same manner as taxes are levied and collected and being a lien upon the land.

The Village may cut the weeds, brush and grass as often as necessary to achieve compliance with the ordinance and charge costs to the property.



Monroe County Animal Control Ordinance

With warm weather approaching we would like to remind our residents that it is **unlawful** to permit any dog to trespass upon the property of another person, or stray beyond the owner's property, unless the dog is restrained by a leash, or within voice command of the owner.

Be courteous and clean up waste left by your animal.

Remember, your pet is your responsibility.


















Cats

In the event that your garbage falls on the ground, please pick it up and bag it so we can keep our community clean.



Please remember that Ord-35,102 Section 2. states that:

- All containers must be taken in before 8:00pm on the day of collection and placed out of general view.
 This includes recycle totes.

STORMWATER- KEEP IT FRESH:

Storm water is any water that falls into the ground, including rain, hail and snow.

This water flows off ground surfaces and into underground pipe systems, where it makes its way into local waterways. Water is our most precious natural resource.

Keep it fresh. Allow only rain down the storm drain.

Tips to keep our water fresh:

- Pick up pet waste and dispose of it in the trash.
- Never fertilize your lawn before a storm. Reduce the amount of chemicals you apply to your lawn.
- If you can, implement a rain garden at your house. Green infrastructure, such as rain gardens, help water absorb into the ground, preventing water and pollutant runoff.



SPRING DESSERT!!

Lemon Pudding Cake (2 servings)

Ingredients:

- 1 large egg
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/3 cup whole milk
- 2 tablespoons all purpose flour
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon grated lemon zest
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- Optional: Confectioners' sugar, lemon slices & whipped cream

Directions:

- 1—Preheat oven to 325 degrees. In a bowl, beat egg yolk. Add sugar, milk, flour, lemon juice, zest and salt; beat until smooth. Beat egg white until stiff peaks form; gently fold into lemon mixture. Pour into 2 ungreased 6 ounce custard cups (cups will be very full).
- 2– Place the cups in an 8 inch square baking pan. Pour boiling water into pan to a depth of 1 inch. Bake until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean and top is golden, 40-45 minutes. If desired, top with confectioners' sugar, lemon slices and whipped cream.
